SERVING: THE WORK OF THE MINISTRY.

- A. Nobody ever becomes a leader without first becoming, and remaining, a server. A person with a true servant's heart ministers out of love, not obligation or bondage.
 - 1. A true server ministers without complaint.
 - 2. A true server always goes the extra mile, doing more than what is required. God, in return, will always reward him.
 - 3. A server will improve his effectiveness in ministry if he will become dependable.
 - a. If he says, Let's meet for lunch at 12:00 today, he will be there at 12:00 or earlier.
 - b. If he has made commitments, he sticks to them!
 - c. If he cannot meet someone or do something as expected and planned, he will be sure to call and notify the proper people, so that they can make new plans.
 - 4. A server will improve his effectiveness if he views his position of ministry as a privilege, and not a stepping stone to bigger and greater things. Although those who are faithful in less responsible positions are promoted, the attitude must be humble and not glory-seeking in order for the Lord to bless it.
 - a. Otherwise, he will be open to the attacks of Satan, especially if his promotion is slow in coming.
 - b. He should not view his ministry as inferior in any way--God set him there.
 - c. He should rest in the Lord, and be faithful where he is, unconcerned about possible future promotions.
- B. A server will improve his effectiveness if he maintains a balance between being fed the Word and ministering to the needs of the people.
 - 1. Balance will be maintained if he comes to at least two services a week.

One service where he can be fed himself.

Another service where he can minister to others.

"It's not my calling."

"I don't have time."
