 - 1. Special place in eternity
 - 2. Requirement to have seen the Lord

 - 1. Barnabus and Paul Acts 14:4, 14
 - 2. Adronicus and Junia Rom 16:7
 - 3. James Gal. 1:19
 - 4. Silvanus and Timothy I Thes. 1:1; 2:6
 - 5. Epaphroditus Phil. 2:25
 - 6. Titus II Cor. 8:23; titus 1:5

IV. MINISTRY OF THE APOSTLE

- A. Early apostles
 - 1. Writings inspired and preserved
 - 2. Transitional link between New and Old Covenants
 - 3. held young church steady in infancy
 - 4. Set in order early structure of church
 - 5. Provided for its continuity and effectiveness
 - 6. Outlined qualifications of those who would minister
 - 7. Took initiative to see that proper leadership was provided

- B. Ministry of apostles today
 - 1. Ground church in truth--not be swayed
 - 2. Minister foundational truth to body
 - 3. Love God's people, desire to further establish them
 - 4. Vision of church at large
 - 5. Seek to preserve unity within churches and cooperation between churches
 - 6. Fathered other ministries
 - 7. Leading individual ministries into their personal function in that body
 - 8. Pioneer churches

- D. Not given to self-glory
- E. Have servants heart
 - 1. Rom. 1:1 Paul, a servant of the Lord Jesus Christ

VI. RECOGNITION OF APOSTLES

- A. Not all will be received as apostles worldwide
- B. Paul was not (I Cor. 9:1-3)
 - 1. Knew where he was received
 - 2. Where he had produced apostolic fruit
- C. How recognized
 - 1. He should know himself
 - 2. Local church leaders should know
 - 3. Recognized by people of local church
 - 4. Known by those he had grounded and established in the faith
