 - 1. Changed behavior comes from changed talk.
 - 2. (Prov 15:4 KJV) A wholesome tongue is a tree of life: but perverseness therein is a breach in the spirit.
 - 3. (Prov 18:21 KJV) Death and life are in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof.
 - 4. (1 Pet 3:10 KJV) For he that will love life, and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile:

C. Thoughts--thinking.

- 1. Changed speaking comes from changed thinking.
- 2. As a man thinketh in his heart so is he.
- 3. Be ye transformed (or changed) by the renewing of your mind.
