- REAL EDUCATION TEACHES THE STUDENT AS WELL AS SUBJECT MATTER.
 - 1. One of purposes of Christian school is character training.
 - 2. Parents entrust school to properly prepare for a fruitful Christian life.
 - 3. God has instituted rules of order.
 - 1. Family.
 - 2. Nation.
 - 3. Church.
- 2. TEN COMMANDMENTS MAKE UP GOD'S ETERNAL MORAL LAW.
 - 1. Cannot produce salvation; only Jesus can.
 - 2. They do reflect the character of God.
 - 3. Serve as basis of righteous behavior and conduct.
 - 4. Summed up in loving God with all our hearts and our neighbors as ourselves.
- 3. RELATIONSHIP TO GOD.
 - 1. Devotion to God (No other gods before me).
 - Should be expected to love God and give Him first priority in all aspects of life. Only the true God should be worshipped and served.
 - 2. Expected to obey the clear teachings of God's word without question.
 - 2. No idolatry.
 - 1. An idol is anything that is a substitute for God.
 - 2. Should not employ objects of worship such as statues or pictures.

- 3. Abstain from anything demonic or pagan.
- 4. Shun away from occultic practices in religion such as astrology, fortune telling, spiritism, witchcraft, Zen, transcendental meditation, yoga, Buddhism, etc.
- 3. No irreverent use of God's Name.
- 4. Regular worship (Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy)

4. RELATIONSHIP TO NEIGHBOR.

- 1. Respect for Parents.
 - 1. Should give same respect to all those in authority.
- 2. No murder or hatred.
- 3. Moral purity.
 - Christians are not to engage in any sexual relation outside of marriage--including premarital sex, homosexuality, incest, adultery, etc.
 - 2. Young people are to flee youthful lusts; should not have sexually explicit materials.
 - 3. Conduct self in proper manner in presence of opposite sex.
- 4. Respect for property (Shall not steal).
 - Taking care of borrowed property; carelessness which results in damage to someone else's property.
 - Unfair business practices, failure to provide adequate work for one's wages, goofing off on jobs for which one is paid.
- 5. No lying (bearing false witness).
 - Maintain reputation for honesty and integrity in all things,
 especially in matters affecting the reputation of other people.
 - 2. Should refrain from gossip and hearsay.
 - 3. Cheating on exams, receiving unauthorized help.
- 6. No covetousness.
 - 1. A form of idolatry worship; worship of mammon.
