DOMINION

(Psa 8:4 KJV) What is man, that thou art mindful of him? and the son of man, that thou visitest him? (Psa 8:5 KJV) For thou hast made him a little lower than the angels, and hast crowned him with glory and honour. (Psa 8:6 KJV) Thou madest him to have dominion over the works of thy hands; thou hast put all things under his feet:

1. GOD GAVE MAN DOMINION.

1. **Definition.**

- 1. Dominion: Force, strength, might, more especially manifested power. Denotes lordship; to lord over; to rule over.
- 2. 4910. mashal, maw-shal'; a prim. root; to rule:--(have, make to have) dominion, governor, X indeed, reign, (bear, cause to, have) rule (-ing, -r), have power.

2. *Adam*.

- 1. (Gen 1:26 KJV) And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth.
- 2. (Gen 1:27 KJV) So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.
- 3. (Gen 1:28 KJV) And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.

3. *Man*.

- 1. (Psa 8:4 KJV) What is man, that thou art mindful of him? and the son of man, that thou visitest him? (Psa 8:5 KJV) For thou hast made him a little lower than the angels, and hast crowned him with glory and honour. (Psa 8:6 KJV) Thou madest him to have dominion over the works of thy hands; thou hast put all things under his feet:
- 2. (Heb 2:6 KJV) But one in a certain place testified, saying, What is man, that thou art mindful of him? or the son of man, that thou visitest him? (Heb 2:7 KJV) Thou madest him a little lower than the angels; thou crownedst him with glory and honour, and didst set him over the works of thy hands: (Heb 2:8 KJV) Thou hast put all things in subjection under his feet. For in that he put all in subjection under him, he left nothing that is not put under him. But now we see not yet all things put under him. (Heb 2:9 KJV) But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man.
- 3. (Heb 2:10 KJV) For it became him, for whom are all things, and by whom are all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings.
- 4. (Heb 2:11 KJV) For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified

are all of one: for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren,

2. JESUS' MINISTRY ONE OF DOMINION.

1. Dominion over sickness.

- 1. <u>Fever</u>. (Mark 1:30 KJV) But Simon's wife's mother lay sick of a fever, and anon they tell him of her. (Mark 1:31 KJV) And he came and took her by the hand, and lifted her up; and immediately the fever left her, and she ministered unto them.
- 2. <u>Leper</u>. (Mark 1:40 KJV) And there came a leper to him, beseeching him, and kneeling down to him, and saying unto him, If thou wilt, thou canst make me clean. (Mark 1:41 KJV) And Jesus, moved with compassion, put forth his hand, and touched him, and saith unto him, I will; be thou clean.
- 3. Withered hand healed. (Mark 3:1 KJV) And he entered again into the synagogue; and there was a man there which had a withered hand. (Mark 3:2 KJV) And they watched him, whether he would heal him on the sabbath day; that they might accuse him. (Mark 3:3 KJV) And he saith unto the man which had the withered hand, Stand forth. (Mark 3:4 KJV) And he saith unto them, Is it lawful to do good on the sabbath days, or to do evil? to save life, or to kill? But they held their peace. (Mark 3:5 KJV) And when he had looked round about on them with anger, being grieved for the hardness of their hearts, he saith unto the man, Stretch forth thine hand. And he stretched it out: and his hand was restored whole as the other.

2. Dominion over unclean spirits and devils.

1. <u>Unclean spirit</u>. (Mark 1:23 KJV) And there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit; and he cried out, (Mark 1:24 KJV) Saying, Let us alone; what have we to do with thee, thou Jesus of Nazareth? art thou come to destroy us? I know thee who thou art, the Holy One of God. (Mark 1:25 KJV) And Jesus rebuked him, saying, Hold thy peace, and come out of him.

2. Cast out devils.

- 1. (Mark 1:34 KJV) And he healed many that were sick of divers diseases, and cast out many devils; and suffered not the devils to speak, because they knew him.
- 2. (Mark 1:39 KJV) And he preached in their synagogues throughout all Galilee, and cast out devils.
- 3. Man from Gadara. (Mark 5:1).
- 4. <u>Boy with dumb spirit</u>. (Mark 9:17 KJV) And one of the multitude answered and said, Master, I have brought unto thee my son, which hath a dumb spirit; (Mark 9:18 KJV) And wheresoever he taketh him, he teareth him: and he foameth, and gnasheth with his teeth, and pineth away: and I spake to thy disciples that they should cast him out; and they could not.
 - 1. Faithless generation. (Mark 9:19 KJV) He answereth him, and saith, O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? how long shall I suffer you? bring him unto me.

- 2. Demonic manifestation. (Mark 9:20 KJV) And they brought him unto him: and when he saw him, straightway the spirit tare him; and he fell on the ground, and wallowed foaming. (Mark 9:21 KJV) And he asked his father, How long is it ago since this came unto him? And he said, Of a child.
- 3. *Cry for help.* (Mark 9:22 KJV) And ofttimes it hath cast him into the fire, and into the waters, to destroy him: but if thou canst do any thing, have compassion on us, and help us.
- 4. *If you can believe...*(Mark 9:23 KJV) Jesus said unto him, If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth.
- 5. *Help my unbelief.* (Mark 9:24 KJV) And straightway the father of the child cried out, and said with tears, Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief.
- 6. *Jesus rebukes the spirit.* (Mark 9:25 KJV) When Jesus saw that the people came running together, he rebuked the foul spirit, saying unto him, Thou dumb and deaf spirit, I charge thee, come out of him, and enter no more into him.
- 7. Response of evil spirit. (Mark 9:26 KJV) And the spirit cried, and rent him sore, and came out of him: and he was as one dead; insomuch that many said, He is dead.
- 8. *Boy delivered.* (Mark 9:27 KJV) But Jesus took him by the hand, and lifted him up; and he arose.

3. DOMINION OVER NATURE.

1. Storm stilled.

- 1. <u>Let us go to the other side</u>. (Mark 4:35 KJV) And the same day, when the even was come, he saith unto them, Let us pass over unto the other side.
- 2. <u>Storm arose</u>. (Mark 4:36 KJV) And when they had sent away the multitude, they took him even as he was in the ship. And there were also with him other little ships. (Mark 4:37 KJV) And there arose a great storm of wind, and the waves beat into the ship, so that it was now full.
- 3. <u>Cry for help.</u> (Mark 4:38 KJV) And he was in the hinder part of the ship, asleep on a pillow: and they awake him, and say unto him, Master, carest thou not that we perish?
- 4. <u>Jesus rebukes the wind</u>. (Mark 4:39 KJV) And he arose, and rebuked the wind, and said unto the sea, Peace, be still. And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.
- 5. Where is your faith? (Mark 4:40 KJV) And he said unto them, Why are ye so fearful? how is it that ye have no faith?
- 6. What manner of man is this? (Mark 4:41 KJV) And they feared exceedingly, and said one to another, What manner of man is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?

2. Walking on the sea.

1. <u>Jesus sends disciples away in ship</u>. (Mark 6:45 KJV) And straightway he constrained his disciples to get into the ship, and to go to the other side

- before unto Bethsaida, while he sent away the people. (Mark 6:46 KJV) And when he had sent them away, he departed into a mountain to pray.
- 2. <u>Jesus walks on the water</u>. (Mark 6:47 KJV) And when even was come, the ship was in the midst of the sea, and he alone on the land. (Mark 6:48 KJV) And he saw them toiling in rowing; for the wind was contrary unto them: and about the fourth watch of the night he cometh unto them, walking upon the sea, and would have passed by them. (Mark 6:49 KJV) But when they saw him walking upon the sea, they supposed it had been a spirit, and cried out:
- 3. <u>Be of good cheer</u>. (Mark 6:50 KJV) For they all saw him, and were troubled. And immediately he talked with them, and saith unto them, Be of good cheer: it is I; be not afraid.

4. DOMINION OVER LACK AND CIRCUMSTANCES.

- 1. 5000 fed. Chapter 6.
- 2. Draught of fishes.

5. DOMINION OVER OBSTACLES.

(Mark 11:23 KJV) For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith.

- 6. DOMINION OVER SIN. (Rom 6:14 KJV) For sin shall not have dominion over you: for ye are not under the law, but under grace.
- 7. DOMINION OVER DEATH. (Rom 6:9 KJV) Knowing that Christ being raised from the dead dieth no more; death hath no more dominion over him.
- 8. POWER OVER ALL THE POWER OF THE ENEMY. (Luke 10:19 KJV) Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you.
