# THE GRACE OF GOD

(Gal 2:21 KJV) I do not frustrate the grace of God: for if righteousness come by the law, then Christ is dead in vain.

### 1. GRACE.

- 1. Undeserved acceptance and love received from another.
  - 1. Especially the characteristic attitude of God in providing salvation for sinners.
  - 2. For Christians, the word "grace" is virtually synonymous with the gospel of God's gift of unmerited salvation in Jesus Christ.
- 2. To express this, the New Testament writers used the Greek word charis, which had a long previous history in secular Greek.
  - 1. Attractiveness. Related to the word for joy or pleasure, charis originally referred to something delightful or attractive in a person, something which brought pleasure to others.
  - 2. <u>Favor or kindness</u>. From this it came to have the idea of a favor or kindness done to another or of a gift which brought pleasure to another.
  - 3. <u>Thankfulness.</u> Viewed from the standpoint of the recipient, it was used to refer to the thankfulness felt for a gift or favor.
- 3. Divine enablement.

## 2. GRACE IS A NEW TESTAMENT CONCEPT.

- 1. *Old Testament*.
  - 1. Used in sense of obtaining favor of another; finding grace in the sight of another.
  - 2. Never used in the sense of obtaining favor, especially unmerited favor.
- 2. New Testament.
  - 1. Grace and truth through Jesus.
    - 1. (John 1:14 KJV) And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.
    - 2. (John 1:17 KJV) For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ.
    - 3. (Rom 5:17 KJV) For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ.
    - 4. (Rom 16:20 KJV) And the God of peace shall bruise Satan under your feet shortly. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you. Amen.
  - 2. Divine favor.
    - 1. Joseph. (Acts 7:10 KJV) And delivered him out of all his afflictions, and gave him favour and wisdom in the sight of Pharaoh king of Egypt; and he made him governor over Egypt and all his house.

- 2. God=s divine favor.
  - (1) (Rom 4:4 KJV) Now to him that worketh is the reward not reckoned of grace, but of debt.
  - (2) (Rom 4:16 KJV) Therefore it is of faith, that it might be by grace; to the end the promise might be sure to all the seed; not to that only which is of the law, but to that also which is of the faith of Abraham; who is the father of us all,
  - (3) (Rom 5:2 KJV) By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.
  - (4) (Rom 11:6 KJV) And if by grace, then is it no more of works: otherwise grace is no more grace. But if it be of works, then is it no more grace: otherwise work is no more work.
- 3. Grace in contrast to the law.

#### 3. OTHER MEANINGS OF GRACE.

### 1. Thanksgiving.

- 1. (Rom 6:17 KJV) But God be thanked, that ye were the servants of sin, but ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you.
- 2. (2 Cor 2:14 KJV) Now thanks be unto God, which always causeth us to triumph in Christ, and maketh manifest the savour of his knowledge by us in every place.
- 3. (2 Cor 8:16 KJV) But thanks be to God, which put the same earnest care into the heart of Titus for you.
- 4. (Col 3:16 KJV) Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.
- 5. (2 Cor 9:15 KJV) Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift.

### 2. Divine power or enablement.

- 1. (Acts 4:33 KJV) And with great power gave the apostles witness of the resurrection of the Lord Jesus: and great grace was upon them all.
- 2. (Acts 20:32 KJV) And now, brethren, I commend you to God, and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance among all them which are sanctified.

### 3. According to God=s pleasure.

- 1. 9 spiritual gifts of 1 Cor. 12.
- 2. I am what I am by the grace of God. (1 Cor. 15:10).
