PURPOSES OF THE CHURCH

"Purposes Derived from Selected Commandments of the Lord"

(Mat 22:37 NRSV) He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' (Mat 22:38 NRSV) This is the greatest and first commandment. (Mat 22:39 NRSV) And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' (Mat 22:40 NRSV) On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

(Mat 28:19 KJV) Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: (Mat 28:20 KJV) Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

1. THE PURPOSE FOR THE CHURCH.

- 1. Why does the church exist?
- 2. What are we to be as a church? (Who and what are we?).
- 3. What are we to do as a church? (What does God want done in the world?).
- 4. How are we to do it?

2. LOVE THE LORD WITH ALL YOUR HEART.

- 1. A word that describes this purpose is worship.
- 2. We love the Lord by worshiping him; when we express our love to God, we=re worshiping.
 - 1. AWorship the Lord your God, and serve him only@ (Mat 4:10).
 - 2. Worship comes before service; the church=s first purpose is to worship the Lord.
 - 3. We can get so busy working for God, we don=t have time to express our love for him through worship.

3. LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF.

- 1. The word we use to describe this purpose is ministry.
- 2. One of the reasons for the church=s existence is to minister to people.
 - 1. Ministry is demonstrating God=s love to others by meeting their needs and healing their hurts in the name of Jesus.
 - 2. Each time you reach out in love to others you are ministering to them.
- 3. A purpose of the church is to Aequip the saints for the work of ministry (Eph. 4:12 NRSV).

4. GO AND MAKE DISCIPLES.

- 1. This purpose we call evangelism.
 - 1. The church exists to communicate God=s Word.
 - 2. We are ambassadors for Christ, and our mission is to evangelize the world.
- 2. The word go in the Great Commission is a present participle in the Greek text. It should read Aas you are going.@

- 1. It is every Christian=s responsibility to share the Good News wherever we go.
- 2. We are to tell the whole world of Christ=s coming, his death on the cross, his resurrection, and his promise to return.
- 3. In the Greek text of the Great Commission there are three present participle verbs: going, baptizing, and teaching. These are the essential elements of the disciple-making process.

5. BAPTIZING THEM.

- 1. This symbolizes one of the purposes of the church: <u>fellowship</u>--identification with the body of Christ.
- 2. As Christians we=re called to <u>belong</u>, not just to <u>believe</u>.
 - 1. We are not meant to live lone-ranger lives; instead, we are to belong to Christ=s family and be members of his body.
 - 2. Baptism is not only a symbol of salvation, it is a symbol of fellowship.
 - 3. It not only symbolizes our new life in Christ, it visualizes a person=s incorporation into the body of Christ.

6. TEACHING THEM TO OBEY.

- 1. The word we commonly use to refer to this purpose is discipleship.
- 2. The church exists to edify; or educate, God=s people.
 - 1. Discipleship is the process of helping people become more like Christ in their thoughts, feelings, and actions.
 - 2. This process begins when a person is born agin and continues throughout the rest of his life.
- 3. The church has been called not only to reach people but also to teach them.
- 4. It is the church=s responsibility to develop people to spiritual maturity.

7. EXAMPLES OF THESE FIVE PURPOSES BEING FULFILLED.

- 1. **Jesus.** If you examine the earthly ministry of Jesus, it is apparent that he included all five of these elements in his work.
- 2. **Paul.** This ministry is summarized in Ephesians 4:1-16.
- 3. The early church.
 - 1. Acts 2:1-47.
 - 2. They taught each other, they fellowshiped together, they worshiped, they ministered, and they evangelized.
- 4. Today=s purposes.
 - 1. Edify.
 - 2. Encourage.
 - 3. Exalt.
 - 4. Equip.
 - 5. Evangelize.
