I. THREE TYPES OF UNGODLY WOMEN IN PROVERBS

- A. Strange woman harlot
- B. Evil woman adulteress
- C. Foolish woman

II. KEEP YOURSELF FROM THE EVIL WOMAN - Verses 27-35

A. "Can a man take fire in his bosom, and not be burned?"

B. Marital fidelity has no price tag--like virginity, once lost it can never be restored by paying a fine

C. "But whoso committeth adultery with a woman lacketh understanding; he that doeth it destroyeth his own soul." (v.32)

D. "A wound and dishonour shall he get; and his reproach shall not be wiped away." (v. 33)

1. When a man commits adultery, he sins against

a. His neighbor, his neighbor's wife, and himself--against his own body

- E. Why does Solomon take such a hard stand on resisting lust's appeal?
 - 1. The adulteress goes for "the precious life"
 - a. Loss of character, self-respect, others' respect
 - b. Loss of family
 - c. Loss of testimony
 - d. Loss of joy and peace
 - e. Smearing of name
 - f. Embarrassment to church
 - g. Possibility of disease
- F. Effects of adultery
 - 1. Against law of God
 - 2. Against mate (covenant)
 - 3. Sin against adulteress and her husband

III. AVOID THE LIPS OF A STRANGE WOMAN - Pr. 5:1-14

A. The lips of a strange woman drop as a honeycomb, and her mouth is smoother than oil (v, 3)

- B. But her end is bitter as wormwood...
 - 1. End in destruction of soul and body
 - 2. Venereal disease and even death are the results
