# REDEMPTION THROUGH HIS BLOOD

I Peter 1:18-19

## I. THE PLAN OF REDEMPTION

- A. Man's disobedience
- B. Penalty of disobedience
  - 1. Death passed upon all men (Ro. 5:12) "By one man sin entered into the word, and death by sin, and so death passed upon all men."
  - 2. Loss of fellowship with God
  - 3. Loss of dominion over the earth
  - 4. Came under dominion of Satan
    - a. Subject to the law of sin and death
    - b. The works of Satan
    - (1) Destruction, sickness, disease, death, poverty, suffering
- C. Penalty paid through Jesus
  - 1. Had to be sinless; not under Satan's dominion
  - 2. Had to overcome Satan
    - a. Victorious in earthly temptations
    - b. Victorious over death, hell, and the grace
  - 3. Jesus declared righteous when debt paid
    - a. We're righteous because of our identification with Him
    - b. Stand justified before God without shame

## II. REDEMPTION THROUGH THE BLOOD

- A. Eph. 1:7 "In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace."
- B. Col. 1:13-14 "Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son: In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins:"
  - C. Acts 20:28 "Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock over which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he <u>purchased with his own blood."</u>

#### III. WHAT THE BLOOD MEANS

- A. To the believer
  - 1. Redemption
    - a. Justification
      - (1) Ro. 4:25 "Who was delivered for our offences, and was raised again for our justification."
      - (2) Ro. 3:24 "Being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus."
      - (3) Ro. 5:9 "Being justified by his blood, we shall be saved from the wrath through him."
    - b. Sanctification

- 2. Protection
  - a. When I see the blood
  - b. Pleading the blood
- 3. Power over sin and the devil delivered from the curse
- B. To the Church (We're one through the blood)
- 1. John 11:52 ("...it is expedient for us, that one man should die for the people, and that the whole nation perish not. And this spake he not of himself; but being high priest that year, he prophesied that Jesus should die for that nation;)--and not for that nation only, but that also he should gather together in one the children of God that were scattered abroad."
  - a. Not gathered around a creed or doctrine
  - b. Common gathering around the cross of Christ
  - 2. Barriers destroyed middle wall of partition
    - a. Eph. 2:13 "But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ."
      - (1) "...who hath made both one and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us..."(v. 14)
      - (2) No more strangers and aliens from household of God
    - b. Color lines washed away by the blood of Jesus
    - c. Prejudice, malice, washed away by the blood
- C. To the Father
  - 1. When the Father looks at us, he sees the blood of Jesus
  - 2. Our past is under the blood--we are guiltless

#### IV. JESUS' BLOOD SPEAKS BETTER THINGS

- A. Better than the blood of bulls and goats
- 1. Heb. 9:13-14 "For if the blood of bulls and of goats, and the ashes of an heifer sprinkling the unclean, sanctifieth to the purifying of the flesh: How much more shall the blood of Christ who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God."
- B. Better things than that of Abel
  - 1. Abel's blood cried for revenge
  - 2. Jesus' blood cries for mercy, forgiveness, and pardon
- C. To demons reminder they were defeated at Calvary
