#### MINISTERS IN TRAINING

- 1. GOING FORTH WITHOUT BEING PREPARED.
  - 1. Story of Ahimaaz and Cushi (II Sam. 18:19-32)
    - Joah to Ahimaaz "Thou shalt not bear tidings this day, but thou shalt bear tidings another day."
    - 2. "Wherefore wilt thou run, my son, seeing that thou hast notidings ready?"
    - 3. "I saw a great tumult, but I knew not what it was."
  - 2. Should not run without a message.
  - 3. There will be another day.

### 2. TIME OF PREPARATION.

- Moses spent 40 years on the back side of desert in preparation to deliver God's people from Egypt.
- 2. Jesus prepared 30 years for 3 1/2 years of ministry.
  - 1. He knew who he was at 12 years of age.
  - Yet he remained under the discipline of his parents until the appointed time of the Father.
  - 3. He fulfilled all the requirements of the law.
- 3. Paul was instructed at the feet of Gamaliel.
- 4. David's progress toward the throne.
  - 1. Anointed king while a lad.
    - 1. Continued faithful to his father's flock.
    - 2. Fought off beast; killed the giant.
  - 2. Remained submissive to Saul.
    - 1. Recognized God's call upon Saul.
    - 2. Knew God's divine order.
  - 3. Time came to be anointed king of Judah; then over all Israel.

- 3. THOSE WHO SERVED AS APPRENTICES IN THE MINISTRY.
  - 1. Elisha received the mantle, but stayed right with Elijah before his time arrived; would not let him out of his sight.
  - Joshua was an assistant to Moses before he assumed leadership of the children of Israel.
  - 3. Timothy was an understudy of Paul.

# 4. UNDER TUTORS AND GOVERNORS (Gal. 4).

- An heir as long as he is a child...(in training) differed nothing from a servant, though he is destined to be lord over all.
- 2. Under tutors and governors until the time appointed of the Father.
- 3. There will come a time that you will take your rightful place.
- In the meantime, that does not mean you are powerless or can do nothing;
   there is work to do as an apprentice.

## 5. PREPARING YOURSELF FOR THE MINISTRY.

- Find a good local church where you can learn; find a good mentor; a pastor that you can join yourself together with, to learn from, and to make yourself available to.
  - 1. Kenneth Copeland served his time with Oral Roberts.
  - 2. Buddy Harrison served time with Kenneth Hagin.
- 2. Become a servant; be willing to do what needs to be done; all ministry is born out of a servant's attitude.
  - 1. Be willing to take the low seat.
  - 2. Prove yourself faithful in that which is another man's (Lu. 16:12) 
    "And if ye have not been faithful in that which is another man's, who
    shall give you that which is your own?"
- 3. Have a teachable spirit.
  - 1. Don't have the attitude that you know as much as the teacher.
  - 2. Don't assume the attitude that you already know as much as you

need to know.

## 4. Become a student.

- 1. II Tim. 2:15 "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."
- 2. I Peter. 3:15 "...and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear.."
- 3. Learn all you can whereever you can; practice taking notes when you hear a sermon.
