RESURRECTION 94

- 1. THE CRUCIFIXION.
 - 1. Friday was a dark day--literally.
 - 1. The sky turned dark.
 - 2. The graves were opened--many were seen walking in the city.
 - 2. What took place when Jesus died?
 - Went to lower parts of the earth to preach to spirits--set captive spirits free.
 - 1. "By which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison..."(I Pe. 3:19).
 - 2. Ps. 24:7-10 "Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors; and the King of glory shall come in. Who is this King of glory? The LORD strong and mighty, the LORD mighty in battle. Lift up your heads, O ye gates; even lift them up, ye everlasting doors; and the King of glory shall come in. Who is this King of glory? The LORD of hosts, he is the King of glory."
 - 2. Col. 2:15 "And having spoiled principalities and powers, he made a shew of them openly, triumphing over them in it."
- 2. THE STORY OF THE RESURRECTION.
 - 1. Jesus had prophesied his resurrection.
 - 1. Destroy this temple and in three days I'll raise it up.
 - 2. As Jonah was 3 days and 3 nights in belly of the whale...
 - 3. "The Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified and the third day rise again..."

- 4. Why had not the disciples heard what He was saying?
 - 1. "For as yet they knew not the scripture, that he must rise again from the dead." (Jn. 20:9).
 - 2. "And they remembered his words..." (Lu. 24:8).
- 2. The day of the resurrection.
 - 1. "And the angel answered and said unto the women, Fear not ye: for I know that ye seek Jesus, which was crucified. He is not here: for He is risen..." (Mt. 28:5-6).
 - 2. "Why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen:..." (Lu. 24:5-6).
- 3. RESPONSE TO THE RESURRECTION.
 - 1. Elders were convinced that he rose from the dead.
 - 1. Gave money to soldiers to lie--disciples stole his body.
 - Faced with dilemma--whether would believe it or not; if believe, faced with choice of recognizing Him as the Son of God who truly rose from the dead.
 - 2. The disciples had mixed feelings, including fear..
 - 1. "And they departed quickly from the sepulchre with fear and great joy..." (Mt. 28:8).
 - 2. "But they were <u>terrified</u> and <u>affrighted</u>, and supposed that they had seen a spirit." (Lu. 24:37).
 - 3. "And they went out quickly, and fled from the sepulchre; for they <u>trembled</u> and were <u>amazed</u>: neither said they any thing to any man; for they were afraid." (Mk. 16:8).
 - 4. When Jesus stood in their midst "But they were terrified and affrighted, and supposed that they had seen a spirit." (Lu. 24:37).

- 1. "Then said Jesus unto them, Be not afraid: go tell my brethren..." (Mt. 28:10).
- "And he said unto them, Why are ye troubled? and why do thoughts arise in your hearts?" (Lu. 24:38).
- 3. They doubted.
 - 1. "Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, into a mountain where Jesus had appointed them. And when they saw him, they <u>worshipped</u> him: but some <u>doubted</u> (Mt. 28:16-17)."
 - 2. "Afterward he appeared unto the eleven as they sat at meat, and upbraided them with their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they <u>believed not them</u> which had seen him after he was risen." (Mk. 16:14).
 - 3. (The women to the apostles) "And their words seemed to them as idle tales, and they believed them not." (Lu. 24:11).
 - 4. "Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed." (Jn. 20:29).
 - 5. "O fools, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken: Ought not Christ to have suffered these things, and to enter into his glory?" (Lu. 24:25-26).

4. HOW WOULD YOU RESPOND?

- What would you have done had you heard the news that He had arisen? They apparently were not anticipating the resurrection.
- 2. What would you have done if someone suddenly appeared in your room--coming through a wall and then disappearing?
- 3. Are not our hearts slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken?

Have our eyes also been blinded?

- 4. Have not miraculous things been declared unto us? How have we responded? Believe? Unbelief? Skepticism?
- 5. Can we be guiltless?
- 6. What have we done about receiving Jesus? Have we not been convinced as the elders evidently were? What about our decision?
- 7. "Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand; by which also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what I preached unto you, unless ye have believed in vain. for I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; and that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures..." (I Cor. 15:1-4).
 - 1. What not the gospel been declared unto us?
 - 2. Have we believed in vain?

5. IT IS TIME TO RECOGNIZE AND TO RECEIVE THE RISEN SAVIOR.

- 1. He is risen!
- 2. And He lives forevermore!
- 3. He has conquered death, hell, and the grave!
- 4. Because He lives, we can live!
- "I am he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death." (Rev. 1:18).
